If you would like to become a member of our parish, please stop by the **Welcome and Registration Table** in the Gathering Space.


We warmly welcome the presence of children at Mass. If your little one needs extra attention during Mass, please feel free to step into the Gathering Space until they are ready to return to the assembly.
