Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. They can be found in the Vesting Room near the font. Ushers can assist you.


No-gluten reception of Communion, the Blood of Christ, is available for those receiving from the cup minister closest to the musicians first. Then all others may drink from that cup.

Low-gluten hosts are available upon request from any bread minister. Low-gluten hosts are consecrated in a separate pyx.


We joyfully welcome our newest members to our family of faith through the sacrament of **Baptism**. Please stand and face the font for the Introductory Rites.






