
No-gluten reception of Communion, the Blood of Christ, is available for those recieving from the cup minister closest to the musicians first. Then all others may drink from that cup.


Low-gluten hosts are available upon request from any bread minister. Low-gluten hosts are consecrated in a separate pyx.

GLORY TO GOD: Mass of Holy Longing Dan Kantor and Rob Glover






RESPONSORIAL PSALM

verse 4 We proclaim your greatness, O God, your praise ever in our mouth; every face brightened in your light, for you hear the cry of the poor.



I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.


I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.






EUCHARISTIC ACCLAMATIONS: Mass of Christ, Light of the Nations Sanctus




PRESIDER: Behold the Lamb of God,

the Father, and the Son, + and the Holy Spirit.


